

Land Management Central Permitting System (LMCPS)

JULY 9, 2018 ALERT! - ROLLOUT OF NEW LMCPS PERMIT SOFTWARE IS COMING SOON!

The Orange County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) has made it a priority to replace our existing permitting/tracking/management software with a Land Management Central Permitting System (LMCPS) in which the involved Orange County Departments have equal access to all the data required to streamline our permitting and inspection processes. The goal is to establish a system that is much more user-friendly, transparent, efficient, and has far broader functionality than the current one.

Orange County Management is pleased to announce that the staff of the departments listed below is nearing completion of its work to develop this new *Energov*-based system, to replace our current *PermitsPlus* system, which has been in service for more than 15 years. The LMCPS Project encompasses several integrated components of land development and permit management within Orange County, and will be utilized by the following County Departments and Divisions noted in **bold**:

- County Manager's Office
- County Attorney's Office
- **Building Inspections**
- **Current Planning**
- **Environmental Health (Well and Septic Systems)**
- **Erosion Control / Stormwater**
- **Fire Marshal**
- **Land Records / GIS**
- **Solid Waste**
- Information Technologies

Development of the new system has taken more than 2 years of work by various staff members. At present, we estimate that the new software system will be operational in mid-to-late October 2018.

For the Solid Waste department, the new system will allow Haulers licensed under Orange County's Regulated Recyclable Materials Ordinance (RRMO) to apply for new hauler licenses or renew existing hauler licenses using an on-line Customer Service Portal. The Portal is expected to be operational approximately 90 days after the roll-out of the initial new system. More information on the Portal will be forthcoming and OCSW staff expects to send out a general information letter to all currently licensed Haulers in the next few months.

Orange County Management will be providing periodic updates on this project to the general public in order to keep you informed of our progress, the latest developments, and what the new software system will mean to you. There will be a new LMCPS Project web page, which outlines the benefits of the new system, provides a continuously updated time line for implementation, and details the project history. Keep checking this web page for updates!
